iPads

As part of the IFTL Trust, at Woodnewton, every child is given an iPad to use to support their learning.

Please could we ask that iPads are in school each day, fully charged.



PE Days

Year 6 PE Days will be as follows:

Monday and Wednesday

Children should only wear PE kit on their allocated PE days.

Children should come to the Academy wearing navy blue or black shorts or jogging bottoms with a plain white t-shirt or the Woodnewton PE t-shirt which can be purchased from our uniform provider. As last year, through our uniform provider, you will have the opportunity to buy Woodnewton hoodies which your children will be allowed to wear on their PE days. If you would prefer not to purchase the Woodnewton PE hoodie, your child can wear their normal Woodnewton branded jumper, cardigan or fleece with their PE kit. Hoodies should not be worn on any other day of the week.

School Uniform

We would expect children to attend the Academy every day wearing a pair of black or grey tailored trousers, shorts or a skirt with a plain white polo shirt or Woodnewton branded white polo shirt. Children can also wear a Woodnewton branded dark blue jumper, cardigan or fleece.

Children should be wearing smart black school shoes and NOT trainers with their uniform.

Please ensure children only wear a watch and stud earrings. Bracelets, necklaces and rings are not allowed.

Please ensure children do not wear nail varnish or false nails.

Lunches, Snacks and Water

Healthy lunch boxes are A MUST!

A healthy snack can be brought in for break times.

Bottles of water are allowed in the classroom.

Juice can be drunk at lunchtime.



Home Learning

We ask Year 6 children to read as much as possible at home. Please talk about the books together as this will support your child's reading comprehension.

Your child will be given a list of spellings to learn each week in preparation for a check at the end of the week.

There are many links to useful websites and Apps to support your child's learning on the Woodnewton website and on iPads. These include Numbots, Accelerated Reader, Spelling Frame, Arithmagicians, Times Table Rock Stars, BBC Bitesize and Whiterosemaths. Children will access the Apps using their existing passwords from last year. If any children need a reminder of login details they should ask their class teacher.

Later this term, we will be sending home a set of revision books in Maths, Grammar and Reading Comprehension. This is to help prepare your child in answering SATS type questions. More information will be given on these when they are passed to your child.



Standard Assessment Tests

SATs

The end of KS2 SATS will take place during the week commencing 11th May 2026.

Monday May 11th: Spelling, punctuation and grammar Test- Grammar/Punctuation – 45 minutes

Monday May 11th: Spelling, punctuation and grammar Test- Spelling – 20 minutes

Tuesday May 12th: Reading Test – 60 minutes

Wednesday May 13th: Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic) – 30 minutes

Wednesday May 13th: Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning) – 40 minutes

Thursday May 14th: Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning) – 40 minutes

Children will also be assessed by their teachers on subjects including Speaking and Listening, Writing and Science.



Standard Assessment Tests

SATs

PREPARATION FOR SATs

At certain intervals during the year we will be helping the children to prepare for the tests by undertaking practice papers.

These will take place at regular intervals in line with all other schools in the Trust.

They will provide us with a clear assessment opportunity so we can see where any gaps in learning are and provide the children with any specific interventions they may need.



Standard Assessment Tests

SATs

How are SATs results used by secondary schools?

Year 7 teachers will be told their incoming pupils' SATs scores. Some use these results to set new starters in Year 7.

Others may use a combination of SATs results and Year 7 CATs (Cognitive Ability Tests) or their own internal tests at the beginning of the new term.

We will be holding a SATs Information Evening later in the academic year.

Consequences

Stage 1 – Reminder

Stage 4 – Reflection – complete loss of playtime for the day (possibly more than one day) – SLT involved, reflective work completed out of classroom. Success Card in place.

Stage 5 – Serious Concerns – meeting with parents and Head Teacher.

* The Head Teacher will address serious issues immediately.
